Addiction: A crisis that affects all of us - A National crisis of addiction is a tremendously huge country wide problem which requires an equally large solution. Happily, in an unprecedented level of cooperation, all 27 communities in Plymouth County, including Brockton, have pledged to work hard together to end the crisis. Police Chief's Scott Allen from East Bridgewater and Michael Boteiro from Plymouth are co-facilitators of a new initiative which is rapidly gaining attention not only in Plymouth County and Massachusetts but across the Country. Chief Allen was in Atlanta the week following Easter for a National Prescription Drug and Heroin Summit. Recently he spoke at a High Level Police meeting in New York, has testified in Washington, etc. This initiative has introduced two unique (thus far) aspects that are proving very effective. Drop in Centers have been opened and more are opening for addicts, families, loved ones at any time. Follow up out-reach visits for 18 months by experienced caring personnel have been established. The coalition leaders hold meetings continually to explore new ideas and to listen to other community groups and leaders to ensure that all addicts and overdose victims as well as families are given every opportunity to be helped. The Abington St. Vincent de Paul Conference is hosting an evening with Chief Allen and others if available to share the wonderful ongoing plans of this Outreach program and to listen to your suggestions

The evening will be held on <u>Tuesday, May 16th at 6:30</u> pm in the Parish Hall at St. Bridget Church, 455 Plymouth St., Route 58, Abington. Light refreshments will be available. Come and listen and find out that help is available. You will be amazed at the different community groups and community leaders that have joined this initiative.
